Nose: Medium-high intensity with predominant red fruit notes—cherry, plum and a floral touch of violets. Spicy notes of vanilla together with mineral and high-roast hints.

Palate: Fresh, pleasant and with good structure. Predominant fruity notes in the aftertaste. Round and balanced

Food pairing: A very versatile wine to match with roast of stewed meat, small game, carpaccio, cured meat, pasta, pates, eggs with vegetables, and sheep's cheese.

Decanter 2017: Silver

Tasting Notes: Intense nose of grapes and cassis with freshly baked bread. Juicy, sweet and savoury fruit palate with lively acidity. Score:91

International Wine Challenge 2017: Silver

Tasting notes: Great berry notes, lovely bright fresh acidity. Tannins are well integrated with a lengthy finish.

Wine Align: David Lawrason Score 88

This sports a lovely, quite lifted nose of blackcurrant/cherry fruit with woody notes, tobacco and gentle spice and a hint of mocha. It is medium-full bodied, with fairly good density. The sweetness and chocolate comes on more forcefully on the palate, muddying the finish. Gets a bit loose and less interesting in the end. Tasted March 2019
